

Executive Summary

The Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University, a leading institution in the field of Distance Education in the state of Assam continues its journey towards expanding its horizon, extending education beyond barriers, reaching out to the unreached and making a difference in the lives of all sections of the society. The University continues in its strong commitment and untiring efforts at providing quality higher education and lifelong learning to the deprived, as well as, denied sections of the state and the region. At present KKHSOU continues to function from its Main Campus at Patgaon, Rani and simultaneously from the City Office located at Housefed Complex, Dispur Last Gate, Guwahati.

The University offers 6 Bachelor Degree, 10 Master Degree, 6 Post Graduate Diploma, 9 Diploma and several Certificate programmes together with the Bachelor Preparatory Programme (BPP) and Diploma in Elementary Education (D. El. Ed) programme. It requires special mention that the University continues to provide free education to the jail inmates of the Central Jails, Guwahati, Abhayapuri and Jorhat, as well as, District Jail, Mangaldai. Also, KKHSOU provides free education to the differently-abled persons along with Self Learning Materials in Braille and audio formats for the visually impaired learners.

The year 2016-2017 is significantly marked by several important events and activities such as the academic activities, social initiatives, cultural activities, second Convocation and yearly held Krishna Kanta Handiqui Memorial Lecture. This year on the 11th Foundation Day, celebrated on 11 December, 2016, the Krishna Kanta Handiqui National Award 2016 was presented by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam, Shri. Sarbananda Sonowal to Padma Bhushan Dr. Mrinal Miri for his wide contribution to the field of education and literature, who had also served as the Director of Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Vice Chancellor of NEHU, Shillong, Chancellor of Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh and as the Member of Rajya Sabha (2012-2016).

Notably, on the occasion of the 118th birth anniversary of the great Sanskrit scholar of Assam, Shri. Krishna Kanta Handiqui, the Krishna Kanta Handiqui Memorial Lecture, 2016 was delivered by eminent filmmaker, Shri. Buddhadeb Dasgupta on the theme "Ärt and Experience on Celluloid", highlighting the role of the artistic vision, nuances of filmmaking combined with his own personal experiences as a filmmaker. To provide a brief overview of the internal activities of the university, the Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) of the University is actively engaged in quality enhancement, developing ICT, Learners' Support Systems (LSS) and Examination Reforms to mention a few. In the area of the Learners' Support Services which comprises a range of easily accessible learning facilities, the University continues to extend its services to the learners through the official University website, University mobile web application, e-BIDYA, Open Access Journals Search Engine (OAJSE), Question-paper Repository, Community Radio Service (CRS) and Multimedia Production Unit (MPU) of the University. The Central Library of KKHSOU continues to play its vital role in the collection, development and dissemination of academic, scientific and technical information to meet the present and the future needs of the University. Significantly, it may be mentioned that in a competition (audio challenge), the CRS of KKHSOU, was conferred the Special Recognition Award by CEMCA and NSDC.

As the Study Centers of KKHSOU acts as a bridge between the University and its

learners some of the new and interactive events. In the year 2016, a total number of 26 institutions have been approved as Study Centers covering 14 districts of Assam. As far as the Jail Study Centres are concerned, the University has also set up 10 new centres across various jails of Assam and the counselling sessions are underway with a total of 24 learners enrolled under programmes such as BA, MA, BCA, CCA and CSTCPM. With a view towards motivating the jail learner-inmates towards becoming reformed individuals of the society, the Brajen Barua Memorial Documentary Festival has been organised by KKHSOU in various Jails across the state in collaboration with the Assam Prison Head Quarters.

In the academic session that begins in the month of July 2016, a total number of 31,941 learners were enrolled in the first semester of various programmes offered by the university and as per the declared results of final semester for various Master Degree Programmes, Post Graduate Diploma, Diploma and Certificate programmes, the pass percentage indicates an improvement in the overall academic performance and success rate of the distance learners of KKHSOU.

Thus, the University continues to march ahead with both its strong vision and mission, striving towards excellence in the field of Distance Education while also maintaining its commitment to the larger social responsibilities.

The Jorhat Regional Centre (JRC), under KKHSOU was established on 1st December, 2013. It was established to assist the Study Centres of Five Upper Assam Districts namely- Golaghat, Jorhat, Sibasagar, Dibrugarh and Tinsukia. At present, there are 67 (Sixty Seven) Study Centres under JRC. The main functions and responsibilities of the JRC as notified by the University vide Notification No. KKHSOU/ Regional Centre/21/2012/43/dated 24-06-2014 are classified under the following heads: Assistance to Learners, Assistance to Study Centres, Assistance to University and Monitoring Functioning of Study Centres.

Besides the above mentioned responsibilities, the JRC Staff has successfully accomplished the responsibilities of various Examinations' Evaluation Zones (from BPP to Degree 6th Semester).

The University has two in-built study centres located at Rani campus and Housefed complex. The two study centres initiated by KKHSOU at Rani and Housefed Complex are offering certain academic programmes in the areas of Computer Science, Library Science and Management.

KKHSOU ICT Enabled Programmes

KKHSOU ICT Enabled Programmes was launched on 22nd January 2015. The idea behind the ICT Programmes was to present the existing ODL system with an enhanced approach leveraging the strengths of ICT to enable better learning objectives in the quality of education imparted to the learners and keeping abreast of the times.

KKHSOU ICT Enabled Programmes continued to accept admissions in 6 professional programmes. ICT Enabled Programmes continued its services to its existing students enrolled during last 2 sessions, while welcoming 181 new learners on board in the year 2016-17 :

- a) Master of Business Administration (MBA)
- b) Master of Computer Application (MCA)
- c) Master of Science- IT (MSc-IT)
- d) PGD in Human Resource Management (PGDHRM)
- e) PGD in Business Management (PGDBM)
- f) PGD in Computer Application (PGDCA)

Services offered:

The learners of ICT Enabled programmes were offered the following services during the year 2016-17:

- a) Online enquiry & admission form submission.
- b) Printed SLM to all new learners and existing learners.
- c) Learning Management System (LMS) to all learners for 'Digital Content' to supplement SLM.
- d) Dedicated student portal for all learners to interact/communicate with the university.
- e) Content loaded Micro SD Cards to those learners who opted for off-line content access.
- f) Student helpline and student support ticketing system

LEARNERS' SUPPORT SERVICES

Learners' Support Services (LSS) constitute the most important component of the Open and Distance Learning system. The University provides self-learning print materials, audio-video programmes and counselling sessions to the learners along with Information and Communication Technology (ICT) based learner support services. The university also provides audio CDs to visually impaired learners.

The following are the ICT based support services provided to the learners-



- 1. KKHSOU Website: KKHSOU has developed a fullfledged website (www.kkhsou.in) with a view to providing all necessary information regarding the University. The Website is also equipped with the social networking site like Facebook (http://facebook.com/ kkhsoucitycentre) to interact with the learners, faculty members and other people. The website also includes the customised study centre search facility based on district or academic programme. The website also supports a facility for learners where learners can subscribe for university related news.
- 2. KKHSOU Mobile Web Application: KKHSOU Mobile application has been launched for android devices, which can be downloaded from Google Play Store. The same application can also be used for nonandroid devices. The application provides students an access to the university portal using mobile phones.
- **3. Web and Audio Lectures:** Video classes and academic discussions are produced and uploaded at You Tube and University's website.
- 4. e-BIDYA: An e-learning portal by the name of e-BIDYA has been launched. It is a digital repository where the study materials are uploaded for the benefit of the learners. All the study materials of the programmes (including BPP, Degree, Diploma, Master Degree, Certificate course, etc) can be accessed in this web-portal.

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- 5. Community Radio Service: The Community Radio, mainly being a platform for the community for taking up community issues, is also an important platform for the broadcast of educational programmes which include debates, discussions, and talk shows. The programmes that are continuously prepared by the Section are given below-
- The educational programme EKLAVYA is broadcasted by All India Radio (AIR) every Saturday and Sunday from 8 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.
- Live Phone- in programme on every Thursday by AIR from 9: 15 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.
- Live Phone- in programme on every 4th Saturday by AIR from 11:30 a.m. to 12 p.m.
- Every Sunday there is an interactive phone-in programme from 4.30 PM to 5.00 PM
- 6. Open Access Journals Search Engine (OAJSE): The OAJSE (www.oajse.com) can be used to browse and search 4,775 Open Access Journals from rest of the world excluding India, 532 journals from India, and 32 Indian Open Access Institutional Repositories. It provides all essential details about Central Library, KKHSOU including access to electronic library, Online Public Access Catalogues (OPAC), and subscribed journals and databases. It also provides email alert service (current awareness sevice) to the learners and is linked with major social networks including Facebook and Twitter.
- 7. Question Paper Repository: A question paper repository has been developed for all programmes offered by the university. The repository includes past examination questions (updated where relevant), and also exam style and standard questions to support and prepare students for their exams.

Multimedia Production Unit

The Multimedia Production Unit (MPU) performs various activities by amalgamating different forms of media in teaching-learning process. In the age of information technology, learners look for more innovative ways to learn rather than relying on the conventional modes of education. Open and distance learning being a flexible mode of education should try to remove the gap existing between teachers and the learners. As such, new modes of educational technology like the audio and audio visual materials can suffice this requirement. The learners can either listen to audio or view the audio visual programmes for their better understanding. The MPU of the University produces academic programmes in audio as well as audio-visual format.

It also produces a weekly educational

audio programme named as '*Ekalavya*' which is broadcast by All India Radio, Guwahati and Dibrugarh simultaneously on every Saturday from 8 pm - 8.30 pm. This is one of the most popular programmes where the listeners provide us their feedback. The Unit also produces audio learning materials for the visually impaired learners of the University.

Ekalavya, an academic programme produced by the multimedia unit of KKHSOU witnessed interviews and experience sharing of some eminent and renowned personalities of the state. For the year 2016 -2017, the following are some of the significant discussions conducted by the unit for *Ekalavya*:

i) Nabin Sarma and Uma Kanta Sarma: Spritualism and Religious thoughts related to Spring time Festival.

- xii) *Phanindra Kumar Dev Choudhury*: Alertness, Honesty and Awareness to be Practised at Public Places
- xiii) *Alaka Buragohain*: Role of Library in Intellectual Development.
- xiv) Anil Saikia: Evolution of Bihu.

Apart from Ekalavya programmes, the Unit produces different programmes for the learners, as well as, regular listeners. Some of the initiatives of the unit are as follows:

a) Audio programmes: The unit also produces different academic programmes in accordance with the University's curriculum for the benefit of the learners. Faculties from the University, as well as, different institutions participate in the programme to talk about a particular subject. These programmes are mostly in talk or discussion format. More than 800 audio programmes have been produced till date and are available at the unit and the University's website.

- Video programmes: In accordance with the *b*) audio programmes, a number of programmes are produced in video format. Noted academicians, journalists, faculties, social workers, researchers, writers, film makers etc. have come to the studio and discussed on various socially relevant topics. These programmes are recorded, edited, and finally produced by the MPU. There are more than 300 such video programmes some of which are uploaded in YouTube and are also available in the University's website. All the audio and video programmes are also produced in CDs and DVDs and provided to the study centres. Some of the memorable events archived are-
 - KKHSOU has been striving to preserve the culture, tradition and ethnic values of different groups of the state. It has already tried to document some of them like Ojapali, Deodhani, Nangeli Geet and Dhepa Dhol from Darrang; Doul Utsav from Barpeta Satra and terracotta artifacts from Gauripur in Dhubri district. In yet another endeavour, the Multimedia Production Centre of KKHSOU undertook a visit to *Sattra Nagari* Majuli in an attempt to capture the popular and well known festival of *Raas* which is celebrated in a most unique and colourful way.

Under the supervision of Dr. Arupjyoti Choudhury, a team of two members comprising Shri. Hemprokash Mout and Shri Bitu Das visited Majuli. They visited different sattras namely Gormur, Kamalabari, Samuguri, Auniati and other relevant places like Kamalabari Milan Sangha, etc. The team videographed the *Raas* festival in different sattras and conducted several interviews with different Sattradhikars of the Sattras. Significantly, the team also conducted an interview with the famous mask sculptor of Assam, Shri. Hemchandra Goswami.

Audio CDs for visually impaired learners: c)There are about 30 visually impaired learners who are pursuing their higher studies in KKHSOU. The learners face great difficulties in accessing the traditional modes of learning unlike other learners. As such, the University has come up with the decision to provide the learners with audio CDs to overcome their difficulties in learning. Now such learners are continuing their studies and are content with this initiative of the University. Faculties of concerned subjects read out the text with necessary explanations for better understanding of the learners. It is significant that few learners have completed their graduation and now pursuing their post graduation programmes by learning from the audio CDs provided by the MPU of the University.

Radio Phone-in Programme

It is an innovative learner support service provided by the University for the better understanding of the issues related to its smooth functioning of the University through its Study Centres. The main objective of the phone-in programme has been to answer the queries of the distant learners as well as the general public with regard to the University's activities and programmes. The three live-phone-inprogrammes are -

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UNIVERSITY ACTIVITIES

Krishna Kanta Handiqui Memorial Lecture



In keeping with its social responsibility towards the gradually disappearing art of filmmaking, the University was greatly privileged to invite one of the brightest minds in the world of cinema for the K.K Handiqui Memorial Lecture, 2016 on 20 July at the ITA, Machkhowa, Guwahati. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Dr. Hitesh Deka opined that a film was a reflection of a community andits larger society and not merely mass entertainment and therefore, it was necessary to both encourage and examine the reception of Indian filmmaking so that it does attain a worldwide reception. The theme of the lecture was "Art and Experience on Celluloid". In his thought provoking lecture Shri. Buddhadeb Dasgupta highlighted the role of artistic vision, the subtle nuances of filmmaking, his personal experiences and most of all his passion for cinema.

Workshop on Anger Management

Inauguration of Model Village and Health Camp by KKHSOU

The University under its "Mother Teresa Social Welfare Mission", adopted two remote backward tribal villages of Rani Block, namely, Hanapara and Dakhin Bholagaon with the aim of developing them as model villages in the course of time. Emphasising the role of the educational institutions towards the welfare of the society, the Vice Chancellor, Dr. Hitesh Deka inaugurated the village adoption programme in Hanapara villageon 7 August 2016. The inaugural programme was followed by a free Health Camp supported by a team of doctors from Gauhati Medical College. The health camp received an overwhelming response by the village folks. The health check up was followed by distribution of medicines to the members of about 45 families living in the village. In a humble effort to encourage students to attend schools, the university distributed free school bags among the students of preprimary and primary schools.

It is often seen that the development schemes of the government do not reach such tribal and remote villages which is why the University as a social institution has come forward to undertake efforts in this regard. The village adoption scheme of the University would include activities such as generating awareness about various government schemes and facilitating proper utilisation of the

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developmental schemes provided by the government.

Flood Relief Camp Organised by KKHSOU

An initiative was undertaken by KKHSOU under the "Mother Teresa Social Welfare Mission" in organising a flood relief camp on 9 August 2016 at Lengerabari village of Morigaon district of Assam. Accordingly, a team comprising both academic and non-academic staff members of KKHSOU visited the village and distributed flood relief materials and essentials like rice, pulses, oil, salt, infant food, mosquito nets and medicines among around three hundred families affected by the flood.

The archived works of Shri. Ramen Barua is the maiden effort by the University in this respect. The occasion was marked by the presence of distinguished guests including Shri. Jyoti Prakash Das, Ms. Pahari Das, Shri. Ramen Das, Shri. Kula Barua, Ms. Malabika Bora among others.

Inauguration of University's Journal and Celebration of Teachers' Day

The first issue of the journal of KKHSOU titled, *Journal of Open Learning and Research Communication* was (JOLRC) was inaugurated by the Vice Chancellor Dr. Hitesh Deka on 5



September 2016 at the City Office at the Housefed Complex in the presence of the key officials and the faculty members of the university. The journal is inter-disciplinary in nature and shall be published annually. However, research in the field of Open and Distance Learning will be given emphasis as is evident from the name of the journal while also encouraging researchers to present their new research findings. Celebrating Teachers' Day, the Vice Chancellor Dr. Hitesh Deka and the Dean Academic, Dr. Arupjyoti Choudhury shared their memorable experiences as teachers along with other senior faculty members of the university who




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Sabha (2012-2016) and is also the recipient of Padma Bhushan for his wide contribution in the field of education and literature.

Dr. Prasenjit Das, Assistant Professor in the Department of English; Dr. Kanta Chakravarty, Assistant Registrar, and Shri. Binod Deka, Systems Analyst participated in two training workshops—"Designing and Managing ODL Programmes", and "Designing and Delivering Online Courses Including MOOCs" held at Wawasan Open University, Penang, Malaysia from 3 to 4 December and 5 to 7 December, 2016 respectively. This training workshop addressed various issues relating to planning, developing, delivering and managing online courses in the context of higher education institutions mostly in the developing countries.

As more and more institutions and individuals are interested in offering online distance education programmes, it is of paramount importance for the educationists and teachers to acquire sufficient knowledge and skills required to offer such courses. The workshops also looked into ideas of designing online courses/MOOCs, strategies for providing 'online facilitations', understanding the basic issues concerning OER, adopting OER to design online courses, platforms available to offer online courses, product evaluation of online courses, evaluation strategies, role of ODL institutions in developing and delivering MOOCs including time frame and strategies to monitor the implementation and so on.

COLLABORATIONS

Collaboration with UNICEF:

Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University, Guwahati in collaboration with UNICEF has undertaken a project entitled, 'Experiments in Adolescents Participation' w.e.f 16 March, 2016 for a period of nine and a half months. The project is mainly intended to engage the adolescents of the state of Assam. KKSHOU has taken up the leadership of engaging adolescent issues through select CBOs in Assam- Kasturba Gandhi National Memorial Trust (KGNMT) and Sadou Asom Moina Parijat (SAMP). The three components (reporting, street theatre and radio) will be brought under one umbrella and the initiative will be conducted by the Mass Communication Department of KKHSOU in partnership with UNICEF, Assam.

As a part of the project, a workshop was organised by the University in collaboration with UNICEF Assam on 'Module Development and Capacity Building for Adolescents in Radio' on 29-30 March, 2016. The University has also been entrusted with the major responsibility of producing a radio programme per month for a period of nine and a half months w.e.f April, 2016. A total of 18 meetings were held over a period of three months (6 meetings per month) with the adolescents, experts of the Community Radio station of KKHSOU and district facilitators of SAMP & KGNMT. The radio programmes were collectively known as 'Puhoror Baat' each dealing with a significant issue concerning adolescents. Some of the issues dealt with were child labour, drug abuse, saving girl child, RTE, hand washing, hygiene and sanitation etc.

Collaboration with NCSTC, Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India

Jnan Taranga has collaborated with National Council for Science and Technology Communication, Department of Science and Technology, Government of India to do a base line study followed by capacity building and content creation for the project Radio Mathematics for the year 2017. The baseline study workshop started on 6 March 2017 at City Campus, KKHSOU. Ms. Shalini Raghaviah, resource person of DST visited Jnan Taranga and trained the participants which included community people, students and few radio staff members. The baseline study of 1100 tribal women within the coverage area of Jnan Taranga was successfully completed on 9 March followed by completion of online data entry by 10 March, 2017. An Advisory Committee meeting was held on 14 March 2017 which comprised of DST nominee and well known Doordarshan personality, Mr. Abhijit Das Gupta, Mr. Sanket Mahajan from Media for Community Foundation, Dr. Aarti Bhattacharya, Former Academic Officer SEBA, Mr. Atanu Bhattacharya, Executive Editor, Satsori, two community members namely Dr. Dipali Oja, Former Principal of Beltola College and Mrs. Bharati Deka, Member of Radio Advisory Committee along with Harekrishna Deka, Academic Consultant, Mathematics, KKHSOU, Dr.Dibyajyoti Mahanta, Dean Study Centre and Project Investigator and Ms. Gitali Kakati, Project Coordinator of the project. The meeting

provided suggestions for the content generation and production of radio programmes on Mathematics.

The meeting was followed by a content generation workshop on production of Radio Mathematics programmes from 14 March to 19 March 2017. Ms. Srabani Ray from Jadavpur University visited the radio station and trained the participants for these six days. By the end of the workshop, ten radio programmes were developed from the participants that will be broadcast after formal launch of the project.

A new project on Disaster Management has been provided to Radio Jnan Taranga by Assam State Disaster Management Authority in collaboration with ARMT. Under this project ten radio programmes will be produced on different disasters after proper research and focus group discussions held with the community people. Presently the project is on pre-production stage.

Another ongoing project of Jnan Taranga CRS is from Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA) on skill development of the youths. The baseline survey of 700 youths has been completed so far.

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COMMUNITY RADIO STATION

With the motto of providing voice to the voiceless, KKHSOU launched the Community Radio Station christened as Jnan Taranga. Jnan Taranga (90.4 FM), the Community Radio Station, broadcasts for 24 hours regularly. The broadcast schedule consists of 9 hours live which starts from 9am till 2pm. The live transmission consists of programmes on health, environment, and life of great persons along with birthday wishes, recipes and beauty tips. Educational broadcast is for one hour i.e from 1pm to 2 pm. Next live transmission starts from 2 pm to 6 pm. Programmes include voices of the community, their issues, culture, education, entertainment and one of the most popular programme 'Monor Khabor'- a regular live Phone-in programme on different social issues of the community. The listeners make calls to the station and provide their views and opinions on the issues.

Jnan Taranga has been trying to reach out to different sections of the society so that everyone gets an opportunity to provide his/her opinion. As such, the community radio service has been broadcasting programmes for woman, children, senior citizens, tribal and ethnic groups, youth and marginalised people. There are different programmes on health, environment, culture, education and entertainment. Different programming formats like radio drama, talk, discussion, story-telling, vox pop, novel transcription, radio magazine, radio quiz and phone-in have been used to deliver positive messages to the community.

Jnan Taranga Wins CEMCA Award

Jnan Taranga has been conferred Special Recognition Award by CEMCA-NSDC for a competition (audio challenge) titled *Meri Prerna-Mera Hunar* organised by National Skill Development Corporation and Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia.

Jnan Taranga celebrated completion of its sixth year of broadcast on 20th November, 2016. Radio staff, community people, regular listeners and well wishers all visited the radio premises on the event and celebrated it by singing songs, expressing their experiences and aspirations being a part of the radio station. Mr.Sarifuz Zaman was felicitated for producing the popular and longest running Live programme titled 'Amar Kobologia Ekashar', a weekly programme on environment conservation. Chinmoy Kalita, child reporter/producer of Jnan Taranga was also felicitated for producing the children programme "Sishu Tirtha" He is the anchor, as well as, child reporter of the programme who takes interviews and conduct discussions among children of different schools. Ms. Reetu Gogoi, producer of the programmes Angana and Sasthya Charcha was also felicitated for bringing accolades to the station by winning Laadli Media and Advertising Award. Mr. Bikash Bordoloi and Ms. Jugasmita Sarma were also felicitated for producing the programme that won the Special Recognition award by CEMCA-NSDC.

In Preserving Retkinong Aalun (Folk Song of Karbi)

Since its inception, Community Radio Station (CRS) Jnan Taranga has constantly been involved in working towards the overall community development. In an effort to showcase different ethnic groups of the state, a radio team led by senior programme producer, Shri. Manoj Kumar Deka had visited a village known as 'Rewa Maheswar' situated near Sonapur. A teacher by profession and also an author of Rewa Maheswar, Shri. Rajendra

Tumung has extensively studied and analysed the Jhum cultivation songs sung by the Karbis. The Karbi people refer to the folk songs they once sang prior to the cultivation of Jhum as *Retkinong Aalun*' which today are almost on the verge of extinction. Moreover, with the discontinuation of Jhum cultivation, these songs are nowhere to be heard.

The new generations have either not heard these songs or are not much keen towards performing or preserving these folk songs. The radio team has been successful in recording many of these songs which has been sung by a local artist named Lohit Ranghang. Shri. Tumung has also provided explanations of the songs sung by him. In its own way, CRS Jnan Taranga has attempted to preserve these folk songs that contain the treasures of common beliefs, local culture and age old traditions of the Karbi people which shall enable the newer generations to learn and pursue further research in this area.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Free Education to Jail Inmates

KKHSOU owes some social responsibility of providing education to certain deprived sections of the society. In conformity with its motto "Education Beyond Barriers", the University established its Study Centre inside the Central Jail Guwahati, Jorhat and Abhayapuri and District Jail Mangaldoi.

Jail Study Centres

In the present era of globalisation, an educational institution such as the University should not be confined to the mere circle of imparting education in a common way. Rather, it should be the duty on the part of the University to make contribution to the greater interest of the society in various ways. Accordingly the University had decided to set-up its study centres at different jails of the state, aiming towards intellectual development of the jail learner-inmates. The first study centre was established at the Guwahati Central Jail and followed by two other jails at Jorhat and Abhayapuri.

In the year 2016-2017, the University decided to start 10 more new study centres in various jails of Assam and accordingly, the study centres have been set-up at Dibrugarh, Jorhat, Silchar, Tezpur and Nagaon Central Jails; Sibsagar, Barpeta, Goalpara, Dhubri and Mangaldoi District Jails. Several inmate learners have enrolled themselves in the BPP, Bachelor Degree and Post Graduate programmes of the

University. The counselling sessions are underway in all the jail Study Centres of KKHSOU. During 2016-17 sessions, a total of 24 learners were enrolled under programmes like MA, BA, BCA, CCA, CSTCPM.

With a view towards inspiring the jail learner-inmates, the University had arranged the "**Brajen Barua Memory Documentary Festival**" in various jails throughout the state. In the first phase of this documentary festival, the Central Jails of Dibrugarh, Jorhat and Guwahati together with the District Jails of Golaghat and Mangaldoi were covered with active support from Prisons Headquarters Assam, Guwahati. Renowned film-maker **Shri Jahnu Barua** had been closely associated with the festival and he interacted with the jail learner-inmates during the festival. Five documentary films selected by him were shown with an aim of inspiring them to be better individuals in the society. Renowned Psychologist Dr. Sangeeta Goswami had interacted with the inmates of Guwahati Central jail and Mangaldoi District jail and had also conducted counselling sessions with them.

CENTRAL LIBRARY -

The Central Library, Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University plays a vital role in the collection, development and dissemination of academic, scientific and technical information to meet the present and future needs of the University.

Central Library, KKHSOU is located at the Rani Campus, Guwahati. The library remains open from 10.00 am to 5.00 pm in all working days. The library is consisting of nearly 18000 print books on various disciplines. Apart from the print resources, a good number of electronic resources comprising e-journals, online databases, gateway portal to e-journals are made accessible to the patrons within the University campus.

The library is fully computerised with an ILS (integrated library system) and also equipped with RFID (Radio-frequency identification) technology.


Enrolment




Fig: Number of Learners enrolled in different programmes of the university

A total of 470 learners were enrolled in post graduate diploma programmes in the 1st semester, July 2016.






Fig: Number of learners enrolled in various Post graduate diploma programmes




Fig: Number of learners enrolled in various Diploma and Certificates programmes




Fig: Percentage of qualified learners in 6th Semester Bachelor degree programme.






Fig: Percentage of qualified learners in 4th semester Master degree programme.




Fig: Percentage of qualified learners in various Diploma and Certificate programme




Fig: Percentage of qualified learners in 1ST Year and 2ND Year D.El.Ed examination 2016.



Significant Accounting Policies

1. Basis for Preparation of Accounts

Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University is a State Open University established in 2006 at Guwahati by an Act of the Assam Legislative Assembly (Assam Act XXXVII of 2005) with a Regional Centre at Jorhat of Assam. It is substantially funded by Government of Assam. The Accounts are prepared in Accordance with the principles and procedures laid down by Govt. of India in the new format of accounts prescribed for educational institutions.

2. Revenue Recognition and Accounting

All revenues and expenses are accounted for on accrual principle with necessary provisions for known liabilities except for the followings :

- a) The fee collected from the students are accounted for on cash basis;
- b) The sale of admission forms are accounted for on cash basis;
- c) Interest on Savings Bank Accounts are accounted for on cash basis; and
- d) Expenditure on charges prepaid except subscription of jurnals, are accounted for on cash basis.

3. Transfer To The Capital Fund

 Assets created out of Earmarked/Designated Funds where the ownership of such assets are vests with the University are accounted for by transferring the amount to the Capital Fund and correspondingly merged with the Fixed Assets of the University. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets.

4. Fixed Assets And Depreciation

- a) Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including all direct expenses related to acquisition and installation. Depreciation is provided on the Fixed Assets under "Written Down Value method" at the rates prescribed by Income Tax Deptt.
- b) Fixed assets of the University are acquired out of the Grants received from the Government.
- c) Depreciation is provided for the year on additions during the year as per guidelines of Income Tax Deptt.
- d) In the Books of Accounts the cost of acquisition of assets are shown to its full value and the accumulated depreciation thereof are depicted separately.
- e) Depreciation on Tangible Fixed Assets are provided on Written Down Value Method at the following rates :

5. Grants-In-Aid

- a) Grants to the extent utilized towards Capital Expenditure transferred to Capital Fund.
- b) Grants to the extent utilized towards Revenue Expenditure transferred to Income and Expenditure as Income of the year.
- c) Unutilised Capital Grant is exhibited in the Govt. grant A/c and there is no unutilised revenue grant.

6. Income Tax

The Income Tax of the University is exempted from Income Tax as per provisions of Section 10(23 C) (iiiab) of the Income Tax Act, 1961. Hence, no provision for income tax is made in the accounts.

7. Current assets, Loans & Advances and Deposits

- a) The details of balances in the Savings Bank Accounts with the Banks are enclosed.
- b) Previous years figures have been re-grouped and re-classified, wherever necessary to make them comparable and compatible with those of the Current Year.
- c) Schedule "1 to 9" are annexed to and from an integral part of the Balance Sheet at 31st March, 2017 and the Income & Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date.

8. Defined Contribution Plan

Contribution to defined contribution i.e. Employers Contribution to EPF are charged off to the Income & Expenditure A/c.

9. Creation of Fund for Social Activities

As per resolution No. BM/30/28/2016 dated 31/03/2016 of the BOM two separate funds for Rs. 1.00 crore each was created for social activities in the name of "Mother Teresa Social Welfare Fund" and "Abdul Kalam Student Welfafe Fund". Both the funds were invested in the form of Fixed deposit and two Savings Bank A/c were opened in the name of the fund for credit of the interest by the Bank and to deposit the employees contribution to the funds and to meet the expenses. The balance of the two funds along with interest and employees contribution and the expenditure incurred out of the income till 31.03.2017 are as follows–
